

HIGH HOLY DAYS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

We look forward to welcoming you back to Beth Tzedec for High Holy Days 5783. We have created a detailed list of FAQs to help you plan for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, whether you attend in person or via livestream.

1. Will there be in-person services this year?

We are very pleased to be hosting multiple in-person services this year including:

- a. Sanctuary Service
- b. Family Service (Hendeles Chapel)
- c. Mezzanine Service
- d. Short & Sweet Service (Outdoor Tent)

We also have special offerings including a meditation program with Artist-in-Residence Aviva Chernick; youth activities, babysitting and a return to our Hot Topics to name a few.

3. What is the High Holy Days schedule? When do the doors open

4. If I wish to participate remotely, will the livestream still be available?

Yes. We will be livestreaming the following High Holy Day services, as outlined in the detailed schedule included in Appendix A:

- a) Sanctuary Services
- b) Short & Sweet Services (Outdoor Tent)

Do I need a password to watch the livestream?

A password is <u>not required</u> to participate via livestream this year.

How does my annual contribution help support our broadcast & livestream initiatives?

Beth Tzedec relies on our members' annual contribution in order to operate. Specific to livestream, the shul has invested significantly over the past two years in digital and broadcast technology to bring our services and programs directly to you, from wherever you choose to participate.

This includes the purchase of high-definition cameras in multiple prayer spaces, the creation of a central studio and the hiring of a full-time technical manager who oversees the delivery of services and programs every day of the week. Therefore, even if you are unable to attend in-person, it is because of your annual contribution that we can bring Beth Tzedec to you, wherever you are.

5. Do I need a ticket to attend High Holy Day services?

Yes, <u>tickets are required</u> and were sent to each member-in-good-standing via Canada Post for receipt between September 6 to September 16. To receive your tickets, <u>you must be a member-in-good-standing</u>. For those who missed our mailing deadline of September 16, tickets will be available for pick-up in the office during business hours through 12:00 noon on Friday, September 23. We will also open between 9:00 am to 12:00 noon on Sunday, September 25th.

Note: If you do not have or forget your tickets on the day of a service, our security guards at the entry will require that you <u>show your identification</u> to gain access to the shul. Please ensure you renew in advance or you will not be able to enter.

6. Can my children accompany me to any service?

Yes, children under 18 are welcome to attend <u>all</u> our services. Adult children 18+ are required to have their own tickets. For all families who have children under 18, tickets have been included in your package. If you are missing a ticket in your package, please contact the office.

7. My adult children fall into the "Generations Membership" age group. Do they need to renew?

Yes! If your child is aged 18 to 3 9, they do fall within our new "Generations Membership" category and while they do not have to pay an annual contribution, they must renew their membership. They must simply click THIS link to update their membership

8. What are Beth Tzedec's COVID Protocols During the High Holy Days?

Beth Tzedec's Re-Opening Task Force (RTF) has taken a leadership role in developing our COVID policies since the beginning of the pandemic. The RTF includes physicians from Toronto Public Health and the specialty fields of respirology and infectious diseases.

While subject to change based on direction from the RTF and the Province, the following COVID protocols have been established:

1. COVID Symptoms

If you are not feeling well or have COVID symptoms, please stay home and participate via our livestream.

2. Masking

During the High Holy Days when attendance is expected to increase this year, we have amended our masking policy from *optional* to *strongly recommended* and encourage our guests to choose to wear their masks.

3. Sanctuary:

In the sanctuary <u>only</u>, we will identify <u>mask-required</u> sections in the Sanctuary for those who wish to wear masks. This area will be segregated from the remaining areas of the sanctuary which will be deemed as "masks strongly recommended". <u>Click HERE</u> for a seating map.

4. Distancing

- Sanctuary: Alternate rows will be blocked off in the Sanctuary to create safe distancing. We
 recognize this may result in members not being able to occupy their favorite seats where they sat
 prior to the pandemic. We are all in this together and request your compliance for everyone's safety.
- All Other Services: Because chairs are not affixed to the floor in all other service locations, they will be arranged to create appropriate spacing.

9. Is there a room where mothers can nurse their babies?

Yes, the Bride's Room (Mother's Room) on the main floor (past the Hendeles Chapel and across from Rabbi Wernick's Study) is reserved for nursing mothers, but nursing is permitted anywhere at Beth Tzedec.

10. Does the synagogue offer assisted listening devices?

Yes, listening devices are available at the coat check for the Sanctuary. Please leave a piece of ID.

- 11. Where are the washrooms? We have washrooms available on the first (main) and second floors.
 - Attendees of the outdoor tent service may enter the building to use the washrooms.
 - We are pleased to offer an All-Gender washroom and an Accessible/Caregiver washroom across from Room 105 in the school wing.

12. Where is the Lounge going to be set up during the High Holy Days?

• The Hurwich Boardroom on the main floor will be available as a lounge to relax and have cookies and coffee/tea at 10:30 am on both days of Rosh Hashanah.

13. What details should I be aware of on the days of the services?

Parking

There is limited space in our parking lot, especially because the lower (south) portion will be designated exclusively for the *Short & Sweet* service tent. Only those with accessible parking permits will be allowed to park in our lot.



While we will ask our local Police Division for special parking consideration on the days of each service, please pay attention to parking signage and be respectful of our neighborhood when parking, including not parking in front of hydrants or driveways. Beth Tzedec cannot be responsible for tickets issued.

Security

Entry to the Property

For security purposes, entry will be restricted to the Avenal and Warwick entries on the west side of the shul. The main Bathurst Street doors <u>will remain closed</u>. At entry, our security guards will require that you show your ticket(s). Please remember to <u>bring your ticket(s)</u> with you so you can enter seamlessly and proceed to your preferred service. If tickets are forgotten, your name will be checked against our membership list and a **piece of ID** will need to be shown.

Bag Check

The safety of our members and visitors is paramount. During the High Holy Days, you will notice an increased presence of security staff both outside and inside the shul. This is standard protocol. Every service participant will have their bags checked (purses, tallit bags). Please do not be offended by this. It is for your safety and the safety of your fellow members.

15. Mahzorim (Prayer Books)

16. Decorum Tips

- Beth Tzedec is a fragrance-free environment. We ask our members to please refrain from using and wearing scented products while attending services and programs, inside and outside the building.
- Please refrain from using cell phones or other electronic devices.
- To minimize noise affecting the services, please do not gather in the lobby.
- · Dress appropriately when attending in-person services.
- Kippot and tallit are provided at the entry to each service.
